ICU List

Hawthorn adopted a new program this year to help students, grades 4-9, complete their assignments. The ICU program was implemented to give students extra support for missing work. When a student is put on the ICU list for a missing assignment, they have several options. They meet with their advisor to set up a 24 hour plan. If they are unable to complete the plan, they go to ICU SOAR. If they have more than six missing assignments, they are signed up for ICU lunch. Students have the opportunity to spend time, one-on-one, with a teacher to work on their assignments. They can also do the same after school. Teachers have seen a lot of improvement this year and far less missing assignments.
