2. Scroll down and click on “Apply Idaho – A Free application to Idaho Colleges.”
3. Click on “Apply Today”
4. Click on “Click Here to Register”
5. Complete the information to register
  - a. Make sure to use a personal email (not your school email).
6. Follow the steps in your confirmation email
7. Login and complete the application process
  - a. Be sure to click on each college you want to apply at
8. Submit applications – You just applied to each college your selected!

**OPENS – OCTOBER 1<sup>ST</sup>**

1. Google: Idaho Opportunities Scholarship
2. Click on the First link
3. Click on the blue – Apply Now
4. Click on “Sign Up” near the bottom of the blue outlined box
5. Click on “Sign up information page”
  - a. Make sure to use a personal email (Not your school email)
6. Follow the steps in your confirmation email
7. Login in and complete the application process
8. Submit application – You just applied for this scholarship

## ***HOW TO GET SCHOLARSHIPS***

- ✓ Start researching college scholarships in advance, become informed about scholarship programs available to you and visit college websites.
- ✓ Apply for financial aid (FAFSA.) This should be your first priority in **January.**
- ✓ Do well in school! Grades matter.
- ✓ Volunteer – be active in your community.
- ✓ Join sports and clubs – be involved.
- ✓ Get prepared in high school by taking electives and advanced classes. Colleges and scholarships look at a student's strength of schedule.
- ✓ **ACT/SAT TESTS SCORES MATTER!** Study for these tests and if you can, take them several times to improve your score.
- ✓ The major you declare can determine the number of scholarship opportunities. Ag, Engineering, Business, Math and Science have many opportunities. Social Sciences, Psychology, and Education have limited scholarship monies.
- ✓ Declare two majors. The first year of college is core and required classes.
- ✓ Apply for as many scholarships as possible. There are merit, community service, minority, and athletic scholarships. Small scholarships add up.
- ✓ *Do not be afraid to write an essay!*

### **COMMON TERMS/DEFINITIONS**

**EFC** – Estimated Family Contribution

**COA** – Cost of Attendance – tuition, fees, books & supplies, room & board, transportation, personal and miscellaneous expenses.

**Demonstrated Financial Need** – difference between COA & EFC.

**Need-blind** – school that does not look at a family's financial situation or ability to pay when deciding whether or not student is admitted. Usually pays 100% of demonstrated financial need.

**Pell Grant** – federal grant based on income – up to \$6895 annually, a gift – you don't repay it.
