



## Program Option Description

### On Campus Learning

Students enrolled in the on-campus learning program can expect to receive much of their instruction face to face. Students should also expect to be assigned “homework”. This “homework” is likely to be practice set problems, online independent intervention work, reading, writing and other independent assignments. Students will have scheduled times where they can receive virtual assistance on “homework” from their teacher and/or instructional aide. This program will allow for specialty programs during their on-campus school day. Students will be given a lunch time that includes a short recess. Lunch served will likely be a sack lunch style in the beginning until we feel we are able to provide warm options in a safe and efficient way. Students will be able to bring a sack lunch from home, but all home lunches need to be in a disposable bag. Under these conditions we will not allow the use of reusable lunch boxes/pails/bags. During this shortened school day, no other recess times are scheduled, but teachers can provide as they see needed.

Curriculum will be fully covered while on campus. The school is making every effort to provide a learning environment that is compliant with State and local Board requirements and still allow for face to face instruction. These requirements must be met or we risk being forced to not offer on campus learning. As such, students who choose to learn on campus also commit to follow all of the required health and safety protocols (including face coverings). If a student breaks these health rules, they will not be able to participate on campus and will need to participate in the on-line program for health and safety reasons.

### School Schedule:

Monday – Thursday 8:00-1:30 for on-campus program grades 1-9.

Monday – Thursday 8:00-10:15 for AM kindergarten 11:15-1:30 for PM kindergarten.

Friday no students will be scheduled to attend school on-campus.

Middle school students will follow their A/B five period a day schedule and class periods will be approximately one hour. All previously approved courses will continue to be offered.

It is important to know that if a family decides they need to change to the on-line learning program they will be able to request this change at any time. If approved to make the change, the student will be able to move to the on-line program. This change will then follow all the guidelines as described below.



## On-line Learning

Our on-line program is to accommodate students and families who identify as high risk due to COVID-19. For these students, we are preparing an on-line program that will continue during these health conditions. When these health conditions improve, this program will be canceled and all students will be required to return to regular on-campus learning. The program will be a full implementation of the required standards for each subject and course. Students should plan to work on schoolwork for 4-6 hours per school day. Their lessons and assignments will be prepared and taught by our school teachers. We are anticipating many of the lessons a teacher does for on campus students can be recorded and/or streamed to on-line learners. Then on-line students will be able to complete the same or similar work as students on campus are completing. Students on-line will be given work and task to complete that will be graded by their teacher. Families will need to commit to a pick-up and drop-off process when in this program in order to get and return student work that is not done digitally. We recognize not all assignments may be appropriately given digitally based on student age and subject course work lessons. The work will have specific due dates and all grades will be posted in Aspire. Students will be expected to keep up with the assignments and teachers will be reviewing their progress. On-line students will have scheduled time they will meet with and get support from their assigned teacher. These times will occur from 1:30 – 3:00 Monday – Thursday and 8:00 – 12:00 on Fridays. These blocks of time are reserved first for on-line learners, but may also be shared with on campus students. In an effort to provide the on-line students with the Charter of Lakeview Academy, we will work to provide virtual instruction and learning opportunities in the arts program. We will strive to also provide reading and math interventions to help students at all levels to improve in their skills. Students will be able to check out a school Chromebook in order to fulfill these online expectations or use their own device. Students in the on-line program will also need to be able to participate in on campus State testing. These testing experiences will be scheduled with the family to help reduce any risk while giving us the data necessary to help each student reach expected learning outcomes. Students who choose on-line learning are considered students of Lakeview Academy and are approved to participate in after school activities if desired.

It is important to know that students enrolled in on-line learning are not going to be allowed to come to on campus learning. Only at the end of each term can families ask to make a change from on-line learning to on campus learning. There will be a process to request this change that will be shared with families as the end of the term approaches.
