



COVID-19 Information For Parents

Definitions:

1. **Quarantine:** Anyone who is exposed to someone who tests positive for coronavirus, over a 48 hour window. Someone in quarantine must remain at home for 14 days, and watch for symptoms of coronavirus.
2. **Exposure:** Anyone who spends more than 15 minutes, within 6 feet of a person who tests positive in a 48 hour window. Lakeview Academy calls this the “6-15 Rule.”
3. **Isolation:** Anyone who tests positive for coronavirus must isolate. Isolation lasts for at least 10 days after symptoms started, AND 24 hours without a fever, without taking any medication.

Examples

Example 1

1. Student 1 attends school on Monday, August 20th. They sit within 6 feet of Student 2 all day long.
2. Student 1 wakes up on Tuesday, August 21st, with symptoms of coronavirus. Student 1 gets tested for coronavirus.
3. Student 1 must **QUARANTINE** while awaiting the results of the coronavirus test.
4. Student 1 tests **NEGATIVE** for coronavirus on Wednesday, August 22nd. Student 1 no longer symptoms of coronavirus.
5. Student 1 may return to school on Thursday, August 23rd.
6. Student 2 continues to come to school, as they have not been **EXPOSED** to COVID-19.

Example 2

1. Student 1 attends school on Monday, August 20th. They sit within 6 feet of Student 2 all day long.
2. Student 1 wakes up on Tuesday, August 21st, with symptoms of coronavirus. Student 1 gets tested for coronavirus.
3. Student 1 must **QUARANTINE** while awaiting the results of the coronavirus test.
4. Student 1 tests **POSITIVE** for coronavirus on Wednesday, August 22nd.



5. Student 2 is informed of the **EXPOSURE** on Wednesday, August 22nd. Student 2 must **QUARANTINE** for 14 days, beginning on Monday, August 20th. While in **QUARANTINE**, Student 2 should monitor for symptoms of coronavirus.
6. Student 1 must **ISOLATE** for at least 10 days, and have no fever for 24 hours, beginning Monday, August 20th.
7. Student 1 wakes up August 30th with no symptoms. Student 1 may return to school the next day.
8. Student 2 remains symptom free while in **QUARANTINE** for 14 days. Student 2 may return to school the next day.

Example 3.

1. Student 1 attends school on Monday, August 20th. They sit within 6 feet of Student 2 all day long.
2. Student 1's father tested positive for coronavirus on Tuesday, August 21st.
3. Student 1 must **QUARANTINE** for 14 days **AFTER** last **EXPOSURE**.
4. Student 1 was last **EXPOSED** to their father on Monday, August 20th.
5. Student 1 remains symptom free while in **QUARANTINE** for 14 days. Student 1 may return to school the next day.
6. Student 2 continues to come to school, as they have not been **EXPOSED**.

FAQ

Question: When does my student have to **QUARANTINE**?

Answer: When they have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for coronavirus within the last 48 hours. This includes, students, staff, OR family members.

Question: When does my student need to **ISOLATE**?

Answer: When they have tested positive for coronavirus.

Question: When should my student get tested for coronavirus?

Answer: Anyone who is experiencing symptoms of coronavirus should get tested and **QUARANTINE** until they get the results of the test.

Question: Should I send my student to school while we wait for the results of their test?

Answer: No. While waiting for their results, students should remain in **QUARANTINE**.



Question: Are students required to get tested if they have been exposed but are experiencing no symptoms?

Answer: No. Students who have been EXPOSED to coronavirus must quarantine, but are not required to get tested. They should only get tested if they begin to experience symptoms.

Question: What are the symptoms of coronavirus?

Answer: The following are considered symptoms for coronavirus:

- a. Fever or chills
- b. Cough
- c. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- d. Fatigue
- e. Muscle or body aches
- f. Headache
- g. New loss of taste or smell
- h. Sore throat
- i. Congestion or runny nose
- j. Nausea or vomiting
- k. Diarrhea

Question: Who should I contact with questions about coronavirus?

Question: Is my student required to wear a face covering?

Answer: Yes. The Governor of Utah has mandated that face coverings **MUST** be worn by all students, staff, and visitors while on campus.

Question: Will I be told who exposed my child to coronavirus?

Answer: No. You will only be told that your child has been exposed to coronavirus while at school.

Question: Will my student be required to do school work while they are **QUARANTINED**?

Answer: Yes. Contact your students teacher and discuss what their at home work will look like while they are **QUARANTINED**.



Question: Can my student attend school while in **QUARANTINE**?

Answer: No. Your student cannot attend school while in **QUARANTINE**.

Question: Can my student attend after school activities while in **QUARANTINE**?

Answer: Answer: No. Your student cannot attend school while in **QUARANTINE**.

Question: If someone in my house tests positive, does everyone who lives in the house have to **QUARANTINE**?

Answer: Yes. The **QUARANTINE** will last 14 days after the last exposure to the person who tests positive.

Question: What guidelines and resources are Lakeview Academy using to make these decisions.
