



ADVISORY HAS STARTED!

PERSONALIZED LEARNING PLAN (PLP)

Students in grades 1 - 6 (even online students) are assigned an advisor. Your student's advisor in listed in Aspire. The advisor meets with your student twice each month to initially create the Personalized Learning Plan (PLP), and then in subsequent meetings, the advisor and student will analyze data, review progress, and discuss action steps towards goal attainment.

Advisors are meeting with your students on Thursdays (advisory period is 1:00 - 3:00) for about 15 minutes. The first session is just a "get you know you" session. Once we have all of our assessment data the advisor will meet with your student to create the PLP by reviewing data, developing goals, and identifying action steps. The PLP will be available to you digitally and you will be invited once each term to meet with your student and his or her advisor to review the PLP.

COVID MITIGATION


