DAILY ROTATIONS




BASE - SESSION #2 BEGINS ON MONDAY

We are super excited for our second round of BASE. With this session, BASE facilitators will travel to a different group weekly and implement an activity. Students attending BASE remain in their learning pod grouped by grade level. This will help us with contact tracing in the event it becomes necessary. Registration for Session #2 has closed. Each day our teachers look at the BASE list and remind their students who needs to remain in BASE. Two things to remember (both are necessary for us to KNOW where kids are):

- 1. Students MUST be on the list to stay for BASE.
- 2. Students on the list MUST stay for BASE unless a parent has contacted the school and indicated the student should NOT stay for BASE.

The new system also allows our students to engage with multiple facilitators and provides students with an opportunity to be exposed to MANY MORE activities. BASE activities may include: music, robotics, coding, movement and exercise, watercolors and teamwork games. Our BASE Coordinator is Sara Tucker. OPTIONAL ONLINE LEARNING

Registration for Term #2 Optional Online Learning for students who are unable to attend face-to-face instruction because of COVID concerns, ends October 5. Students enrolled in the optional online learning program MUST complete 30 minutes of reading and 30 minutes of math using our Imagine Learning programs EACH day for attendance.

We are super impressed that our parking lot is cleared out within 15 minutes each day. I have been to many charter and district schools where it is often close to 30 minutes before the parking lot is empty. However, that doesn't mean there aren't concerns regarding student safety. PLEASE help us keep you and your family safe by following these rules:

- No cell phone use while driving or walking through the parking lot. Distracted drivers are dangerous and distracted pedestrians are not paying attention to their own safety.
- Pull as far forward as possible. Your students will be lining up near the north side of the
 portico. Pulling forward AS FAR AS POSSIBLE allows more cars to stack along the curb
 and more students to load in cars quickly.
- Be courteous allow others to merge in from the parking lot and bypass lane to the exit lane.
- Walk across the crosswalk at the front of the school to pick up your students. PLEASE do
 not wave your kids across the parking lot.
- For your safety, PLEASE do not park on the west side of Midland Drive and try and run
 across the road. If you choose to park there, NEVER direct your child to run across the
 road to your car. If you are parking here, you MUST exit your car and come to the front of
 the school and escort your child to your car.
- Most importantly be kind and patient. Everyone wants the same thing quick exit and the safety of our kids.



Students participate each week in Visible Learning. During this special students learn about the character traits that define a successful lifelong learner. This week kids learned about taking initiative - you know - doing things BEFORE they are asked. Learning how to reach out for help instead of sitting and waiting for someone to recognize they need something. Ask your child about "initiative" - use the vocabulary at home. Reward them for showing initiative through specific positive praise such as, "Joey, I liked how you put away your crayons without me even asking. That shows me you are taking initiative."



EVERYONE 3+ MUST WEAR A MASK

Beginning Monday EVERYONE age 3+ MUST wear a mask to stand under the front portico or on the sidewalk to wait for their student OR upon entering the front doors into the vestibule. The Governor has declared that masks MUST be worn on school property. Please help us remain in compliance with the state order and help us keep our kids, staff and families safe.

PS - we have gone through the entire box of masks donated by the Governor. These masks are washable and intended to be returned to the dirty mask basket each day after school. If you have any of these blue and white striped masks laying around your house, please bring them to the front foyer and put them in the Dirty Mask basket. If you have sewing skills and wish to donate masks for our kiddos that would be stupendous and the value would count towards the 30 requested volunteer hours (see our website at <u>DONATE</u>).
