We will also purchase technology that will give jr. high teachers tools to regularly monitor and record student progress and mastery of the state core curriculum. With the plan to purchase additional data collection technology in the following year to expand the program to other grades if there is noted success with jr. high students.

Progress will be measured through ongoing in-program assessments after each science unit is completed in grades k-8. We will measure progress with end of the year CRT scores, Core Knowledge assessments, or SAT results. We expect 70% of our students to be at mastery in science state core standards.

Excelsior Academy will use School LAND Trust money to purchase equipment and supplies to support science curriculum based on Core Knowledge 180 day plans. Purchases will include non-consumable items based on the needs of individual grades. Including microscopes, orbit globes, life size skeleton, etc. Jr. high classroom(s) will also be equipped with a class set of digital data collection devices to support formative assessments at the beginning of each period.
