Welcome back!

It's been a hectic week – again – trying to comply with the new testing guidelines from the state. Our priority is to do everything we can to continue to offer extracurricular opportunities for your cadets. In order to do so, cadets who wish to participate in these opportunities will be required to test at the school once every two weeks. The test kits were provided by the state and we will schedule test sessions as soon as we have the protective equipment also required to administer the tests.

Testing is strictly voluntary. No cadet will be tested without parental consent. All test results will be used to clear cadets for extracurricular activities, including sports, and will be shared with the state. Please see individual emails from earlier in the week for further information on the type of test we will use and **required consent forms**. If you need a paper form, your cadet can get one from the front office or from his/her coach or team time instructor. The consent from is the 1st necessary step in the process of testing your cadet and clearing them for extracurricular activities.

Step 2 of the process will be enrolling your cadet on the REDCAP website. You will be getting a link to sign into the system and fill out your cadet's information. This is the system the state will use to access the test results. It is also the system the school can use (with your permission) to email you the results of your cadet's test.

If your cadet plans to participate in a Team Time activity, please have them sign up with the instructor of that activity so we can create attendance rosters. They are welcome to sign up for up to one Team Time for each day. They should sign up even if they are doing a study hall – they won't be required to test, but it still allows us to track attendance.

9. Scholarship Opportunities:

- Parents of Seniors, if you have not completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) please do so. Your student may qualify for a scholarship but not be able to get it because the FAFSA was not completed. Even if you don't qualify for grants (free \$ for college) most colleges require the FAFSA from in order to receive a scholarship. Please go to fafsa.gov to get started.

- Coolidge Scholarship (Juniors): The Coolidge Scholarship is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that may be used by recipients for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States. Any high school junior who plans to enroll in college in the fall of 2022 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (current high school seniors are not eligible to apply).
- **USCA Scholarship:** Formerly known as the Lynn Jensen Scholarship, the application is available through this link: http://www.utschoolcounselor.org/counselor-recognition.html. Write about a School Counselor that has helped you. Applications are due January 15, 2021 for this \$500 scholarship.
- Regents Scholarship: Seniors, the regents scholarship is for academically qualified students. Please view the information here: https://ushe.edu/state-scholarships-aid/regents-scholarship/regents-2021-applicants/ The priority deadline to apply is TODAY.
- The Utah Promise Scholarship is a needs based scholarship available at all USHE institutions (all Utah tax payer funded colleges). Just google Utah Promise and the college of your choice. For example, Utah Promise SUU https://www.suu.edu/finaid/accessutahpromise.html

- Scholarships for Engineering and Architecture-Bound Students: The Great Basin Post of the Society of American Military Engineers invites high school seniors attending a Utah high school who plan to pursue an ABET (Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology) accredited engineering degree, a NAAB (National Architectural Accreditation Board) architecture degree, or a Construction Management degree to apply for a Lt. Col. G. Roger Sunada \$1,800 college scholarship. Award of multiple scholarships is anticipated. Just fill out an application with two

short essays telling them what you hope to contribute to society through a career in engineering or architecture. No military service required. 10. We will administer the ACT at the school March 17. This test session is open to Juniors only. Juniors wishing to apply to a service academy or ROTC scholarship need to make sure to get an ACT or SAT test done asap and it would benefit them greatly to take it more than once! For context - as a high school student, you must have a 26 ACT to apply for an Air Force ROTC scholarship, but there is no limit on the number of times you can take it!

For other test opportunities you can go to ACT.org to register for an ACT test, and CollegeBoard.org for an SAT test. The next ACT is Feb 6 with an application deadline of Jan 8. Please note, if you are applying to West Point you must also take the essay portion. If your cadet is not yet a junior, but is interested in an Academy or ROTC, please encourage them to take one or both of these tests as early as possible and often!

Keep checking West Point's website to find out when they open their applications. Remember, if you can't find the link, just google the name of the academy and the words "summer seminar."


**The SBO will also host various games and activities for cadets and teachers to help countdown the final days before Winter Break so stay tuned for more information on those!
