Required: Meaningful Student Action

The ACTION CYCLE is an essential element of an IB PYP education. At Hawthorn Academy, we believe that learning must extend beyond the academic into socially responsible attitudes and thoughtful, appropriate action.

We encourage students to act on what they are learning through the action cycle: REFLECT, CHOOSE, and ACT. Reflection allows learners to make informed choices, which drives effective action. Student initiated action demonstrates deeper learning through service to peers, our school, our community or our planet. Action can be taken by an individual student or group of students working collaboratively.

Task: As an individual, or as a group, show student-initiated action through planning and carrying out a meaningful, student-initiated service project. The project should take at least an hour for the kindergartner.

Service projects must be approved in advance by your teacher no later than **May 3, 2021**. After the project is complete, you will need to write a reflection and prepare a poster presentation to share with your class. (Online students can record their presentation and email it to their teacher). The student, the parent/guardian, and the teacher will sign off when you have completed this task. The poster will be on display at the school.

Caring: Perform six good deeds at home.

Caring: Help your family with chores at least once a week without complaint.

Balanced: Identify nutritious foods that are appropriate for breakfast. Plan three well-balanced meals.

Thinker: Demonstrate responsibility by completing 10 Kids A-Z stories (with comprehension questions).

Knowledgeable: Master addition and subtraction facts through the sum of 0-5.

	Knowledgeable: Count to 100 by 1's, 5's, and 10's.		
	Inquirer- Learn about something at home that interests you. Present it to the class as a project (i.e. poster, book, mobile, drawings, etc.). Projects must show that forethought time and effort was put into learning something new. You must schedule the class presentation with the teacher in advance.		
	Open-Minded: Draw a picture and write a complete sentence telling how you can be open-minded when meeting people who are different from you. Drawings must include 3-5 colors, fill an entire 8 ½ x 11 paper, and show a quality of work as to be presented in the classroom. Must be turned in by March 1.		
	Courageous: Develop three art projects outside of school and present them to the class(record a video for online students). You must schedule the presentation with the teacher in advance.		
	Communicator- Discuss your 3rd quarter report card with your parents. Print off the report card and tell your teacher one area where you are excelling and one area where you can improve.		
	Reflective: I can tie my own shoelaces and zip my coat. Explain why it is important to have tied shoes and zipped coats?		
	Courageous: Design and complete an enriching activity of your own. Have a teacher sign off on your plan before you begin.		
	Knowledgeable: cook two recipes for your family.
