### DRESS CODE REMINDERS

As warm weather is upon us please remember we still have a dress code even on dress down days:


- Closed toed shoes only NO flip flops or sandals.
- Skirts, skorts, shorts, and dresses must be no shorter than 4" above the knee unless leggings or tights are worn underneath (leggings or tights must be black or white only)
- Shirts must have a sleeve that is at least 3" wide (tank tops and spaghetti strap tops not allowed) and must be long enough that the belly or midriff are not visible.

### KINDERGARTEN ROUND UP FOR 2021-2022



will receive an email with instructions for signing up for a time slot. During our kindergarten round up, students will take a short assessment to help us with classroom assignments. Parents will meet with the principal (Lani Rounds). Then, after 15 minutes, students and parents are reunited to meet the teachers and see the classrooms. We are SUPER excited to meet our newest Bulfrogs!



Grades for Term #3 have been posted and sent home with your students.



Just another reminder that we use MASTERY to determine a student's level (grade) in reading, math and writing (grades 3+). A student who has achieved mastery (4 on the report cards) is at "grade level" and has mastered that content for the current grade. Since we just completed the end of Term #3, students who are on track to reach mastery would receive a "3" on their report card. Students who receive a 2 are below expectation of reaching mastery and students who receive a 1 are significantly below the expectation of grade level mastery.

Grades are determined based on middle of year assessments for DIBELS, Imagine Learning reading and math, a classroom math assessment, and for grades 3+, the writing grade is based on a RISE benchmark test.

In the next month or so students will take end of year (EOY) assessments for Imagine Learning reading and math, DIBELS reading and and math, and RISE Summative (grade 3+) for



reading, writing, science and math. The data from these assessments will be reported on the Term #4 EOY report card. The data is also critical to help us guide our curriculum and teacher training needs for the upcoming school year.
