8. New legislation passed during the 2021 session created a simplified, statewide, achievement-based scholarship—the Opportunity Scholarship. **The Opportunity Scholarship** will be available to students beginning with the high school graduating class of 2022.

To qualify, students must:

- -Graduate from a Utah high school with a 3.3 cumulative high school GPA
- -Complete 1 Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), or Concurrent Enrollment (CE) course in each of the core areas: Language Arts, Math, and Science
- -Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- 9. American Legion Boys State will be offered virtually this year. Registration is open now and will close on May 15th. You must be a junior with a minimum 2.0 GPA. Go to: https://utahboysstate.org to learn specific details of the program. Cadets can earn 3 Political Science credits from Weber State. These are transferable to most Utah colleges. Girls who were selected last year when it was cancelled are invited to attend this year in addition to those girls selected from the junior class this year. - 11. If your cadet needs to be COVID tested and was not previously registered in RedCap, the state has updated the link for Utah Military Academy. If you need to register your cadet, please use this link: https://redcap.link/utah.gov-UtahMilitaryAcademy. We will no longer be testing for cadets participating in Team Time. Only those cadets who are on competition teams (Raiders, Soccer, Track & Field, etc.,) need to be tested every two weeks between now and the end of the year.

Attch: Junior Senior Prom Dress Code

PROM DRESS CODE

Men's Attire (Tux or Service Dress)

- Must be cleaned, pressed
- No color requirement, but it should be a tux not a business suit
- * if not from UMA, date must still conform to the dress code







Women's Attire (Modest formal gown or Service Dress)

- Must be cleaned, pressed
- Floor length
- Open back may come no more than to the midpoint of the back
- Start of slit may come no more than 3" above the knee
- Spaghetti straps are allowed with a shawl
- Halter style or off shoulder may be worn
- No strapless gowns
- Modest cleavage
- No 2 pieces
- No stilettos (they will damage the floor and can cause injury)
