

SEM EXPRESSION STYLES

Below are possible products to ***SHOW WHAT YOU KNOW*** about each topic provided.

1.	Artistic	Create a book cover for your topic. Include in the cover: book title, author, and related image. Inside flap: a paragraph summary. Back flap: biographical paragraph about the author. Back: comments from readers, and a spine.
		Create a cross-cut model or diagram. Include details about each part.
		Create 5 or more 3" x 5" trading cards. Each card includes a colored picture, at least three facts, and information on both sides. Store in an envelope or similar.
2.	Audio/Visual	Create a photo story on your topic and narrate each story. Script must be included.
		Create an infographic on your topic. Record yourself explaining your graphic choices and the information on your infographic.
		Create a documentary or mock podcast on your topic.
3.	Commercial	Create an advertisement. Include a slogan, colored picture, price, and information about your topic.
		Perform a 2-4 minute infomercial for your topic with prop(s) and maybe include more than one person. Script must be included.
		Create a lean business plan (1 page) around your topic. What does your topic have that others will want? Who will invest? Who will be your customer? How will you advertise? What sets your business apart from others?
4.	Dramatization	Turn your written storyboard into a movie. The movie needs to include pertinent information about the topic.
		Perform a puppet show sharing/teaching others about your topic. Script must be included.
		Write or perform a 5-10 minute play/skit regarding your topic. It should include some props and costuming. It may contain more than one person.
5.	Manipulative	Create a 20 card (10 pair) concentration game. You can match words and pictures which are only on one side of the cards. Include a key that shows the matches. Store in an envelope or similar.
		Create a 6-sided cube from an 8.5" x 11" piece of paper. Each of the six sides is filled with information.
		Using building materials on hand, create a model complete with essential components for your topic. Provide pictures, diagrams, or a video tour of your model.

6.	Musical	Write or perform an original song or rap. The lyrics present the information on your topic.
		Using existing titles available, create a soundtrack list of songs for your topic. Include the title, artist, length, and how each title connects or supports your topic. This does not need to contain the actual song recordings.
		Create a music video for your topic.
7.	Oral	Conduct an interview with at least eight prepared questions. The person you interview must be an “expert” and qualified to provide answers based on your topic.
		Create a script or recording of a news report that addresses who, what, where, when, why, and how of your topic.
		Participate in and lead a discussion with your family regarding the topic.
8.	Service	Create a tri-fold to display associated with the topic that could be used at an establishment or business. It needs to contain pictures and text which best explains the topic.
		Create a class game which allows your whole class to participate and your teacher may use with future classes. It should have few, easy-to-follow rules, be original or a twist on an existing game, and have multiple opportunities to participate (rounds, questions...) Include an answer key for quiz-type games.
		Teach another about your topic. Include a lesson plan of resources, items you must cover as the teacher, and a graded quiz for your student(s).
9.	Technology	Using computer software, create a pie or bar graph. It must include a title, label each area, color coded, a key.
		Create a Google Slides or similar presentation with at least 10 informative slides. Each slide has a title, no more than 10 words, and no more than one graphic.
		Create a WebQuest focused on your topic. The WebQuest includes links or scannable QR codes for at least five quality websites and three questions per site.
10.	Written	Write a 10 page children’s book centered on your topic. Each page should have an illustration to accompany the written words. Include a cover with the title, student name as the author, and an associated picture. Informational text should include credit to the sources of information.
		Write a diary/journal from a point-of-view appropriate for your topic (scientist, explorer, story character, science element, etc.). Include at least 10 days, the date (either historical or current), and important information about your topic.
		Create an acrostic poem for your topic where each phrase provides information regarding your topic.
