JumpRope: The online grade book is another valuable resource. Students and parents can track a student's academic scores throughout the year. This will allow you to know, at any time, a student's overall grade, individual assignment grades, as well as any tardies or absences that may have been recorded. Emails will be sent every Tuesday with an updated grade.

Google Classroom: I will be using Google classroom mainly for the use of students that are required to either quarantine or stay home this year. I will be updating small assignments daily but ONLY students not in class in person will be asked/required to complete assignments. This is NOT my main source. I expect students to be in class every day possible.

Student Portfolios: Students will be keeping a portfolio of their high quality work throughout the year. We will use these portfolios during conferences and special celebrations of learning.

Assignments and all other work in class will be expected to be completed to the best of each student's ability. **Homework** will be expected to be turned in **on time and completed neatly.** Students are responsible for turning in all work assigned in class, whether absent or not.

Late work does not meet the expectations of the classroom, but under the circumstance it does happen the student is given **two days** to complete and turn in the missed work to receive full credit. Assignments may be turned in up to 2 weeks after due date but cannot receive more than 50% of the credit. Anything turned in after the second week will be given no credit.
