Excelsior Academy participates in the federal Title I program as a targeted assistance school.

What is Title I?

- A federal allocation of funds for the purpose of assisting students to reach proficiency.
- Benefits to the school for receiving Title I funds:
 - Minimize student removal from the regular classroom
 - o Identify students who are falling behind academic standards
 - o Targeted interventions for students who need additional help.
- EA receives Title I funds based on the number of students who qualify for free/reduced lunch. Even though lunch and breakfast are free, the school benefits from families filling out the lunch application. It's not too late to complete this application!
