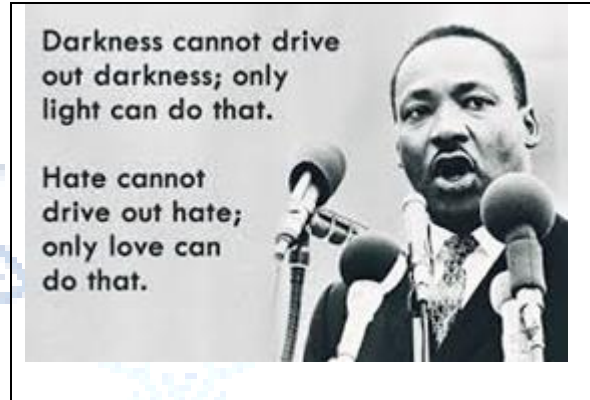

Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Martin Luther King Jr. was born January 15, 1929. He was a great man, and was famous for many things, including his "I Have A Dream" speech, given on August 28, 1963 where he talked about equal rights for all people.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day is important because it reminds us of the things he did over his life to help others. He was the most visible spokesperson and leader of the civil rights movement. Furthermore, he was a very selfless person.



Martin Luther King Jr. led the 1955 Montgomery Bus Boycott to end segregation on busses in Montgomery, Alabama. He gave his "I Have A Dream" speech to start a movement for racism to end in the USA.

Martin Luther King Jr. was the most visible person and leader of the Civil Rights Movement. His goal in making his "I Have A Dream" speech was so that all people could have civil and economic rights that were equal, and to end racism in the U.S. He died April 4, 1968 when he was shot outside of his hotel room in Memphis, Tennessee. He was pronounced dead at St. Joseph's Hospital in Memphis.

While his death was a tragedy, his dream fortunately lives on, and those who share his dream of equal rights for people of all nationalities and races can learn to judge others "not by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character." (King, 1963)

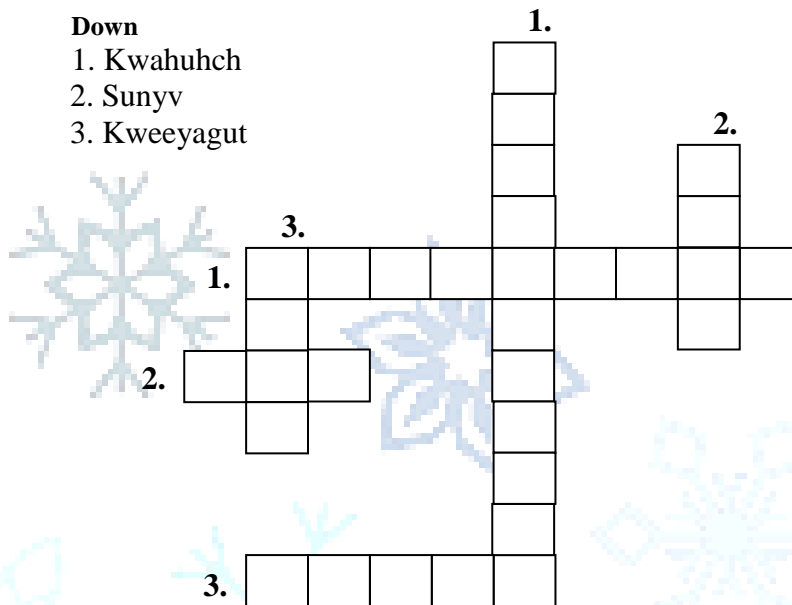
